My research broadly examines the causes the causes and consequences of social and economic inequalities in the United States and other affluent nations. My scholarship explores how major changes in the economy, such as the growth of finance and globalization, has impacted income inequality and the quality of life for workers. My research on the impacts of immigration on small towns and large cities, as well as my work on the causes of white-Latino segregation, explores how demographic, social, and political-economic factors shape the communities that we live. Finally, my research on the effects of religion on job discrimination has influenced other scholars and has been covered by news outlets like the Washington Post and BBC. While the main goal is to contribute to theoretical and methodological debates in the academy on the causes and consequences of inequality, my research agenda also has policy-relevant implications that I hope to pursue more as my career advances.
