The School of History and Sociology (HSOC) at the Georgia Institute of Technology offers an M.S. and Ph.D. in the History and Sociology of Technology and Science (HSTS). This interdisciplinary degree program trains students in advanced scholarly research on the historical, social, and cultural dimensions of science and technology, past and present.

» FUNDING

Funding for students is awarded on a competitive basis, for both the M.S. and Ph.D. program. Most Ph.D. students receive more than four years of funding. Supplemental fellowships and summer funding opportunities are also available.

» COMMUNITY

Graduate students participate in the HSOC Speakers Series, which brings visiting scholars from around the country, as well as their own Graduate Forum, which offers professionalization workshops on conference presentations, course and syllabi construction, and navigating the academic job market, among other topics.
